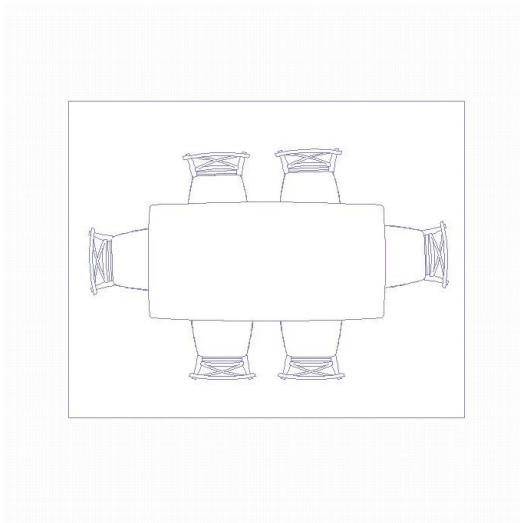


Area Rug Guide

How to Select the Right Size Area Rug

THE MOST COMMON MISTAKE WHEN BUYING AN AREA RUG IS CHOOSING A SIZE THAT IS TOO SMALL FOR YOUR SPACE. IT'S RECOMMENDED TO DETERMINE THE APPROPRIATE SIZE OF RUG BASED ON YOUR FURNITURE CONFIGURATION, NOT ON YOUR ROOM SIZE. A GUIDELINE TO DETERMINE THE BEST RUG SIZE IS TO ALWAYS CONSIDER THE FURNITURE PLACEMENT OVER THE ROOM SIZE.

THIS "RULE" IS ESPECIALLY TRUE FOR PLACING A RUG IN A LIVING ROOM, DINING ROOM, OR BEDROOM.



Did You Know

It is always safest to go BIGGER when choosing the size of your area rug.

If you are having trouble determining the best size, try taping out the dimensions of the area rug on the floor.

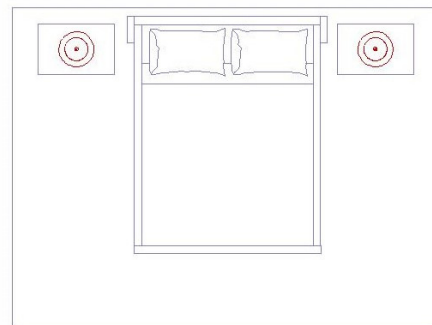
Did you know that you can layer area rugs?

You can even place area rugs on a carpeted floor!

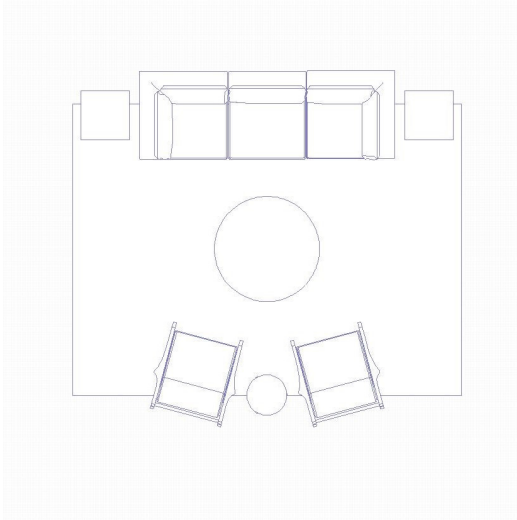
Don't Forget

Don't forget to consider the use of the room and determine if there are any factors that will affect the area rug such as door swings, floor vents, high traffic areas, etc.

It is recommended that you use a rug pad - it acts as a buffer increasing your floor's lifespan. It will prevent dirt and other debris from getting trapped underneath your area rugs.

Living Room

TYPICAL SIZES: 8'X10' & 9'X12'

The front legs of the sofa and chairs should be placed on the area rug.

1/3 of the furniture should be on the area rug.

Try to place the longest length of the area rug parallel to the sofa.

Your rug should be at least

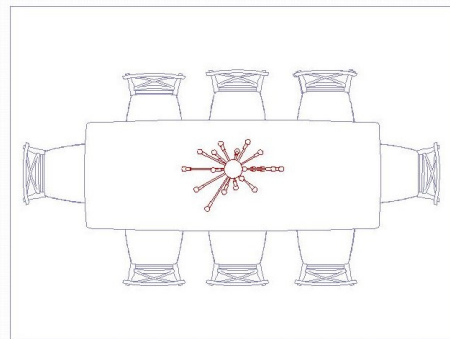
Dining Room

TYPICAL SIZES: 8'X10' & 9'X12'

The dining table and all chairs should be placed on the area rug.

Make sure you have enough space around the dining table (24") to be able to pull out the chairs.

Low pile area rugs are best for dining spaces.



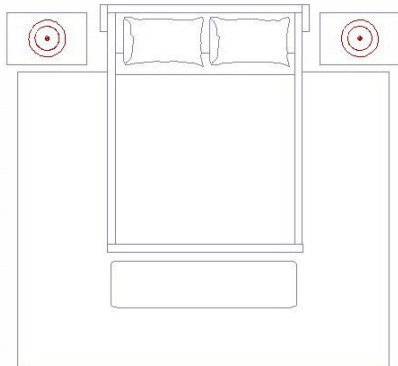
Bedroom

TYPICAL SIZES: 8'X10' & 9'X12'

If you have enough room, the area rug can be placed under the night stands. If not, +/-8" between the rug and night stand is recommended.

Try to place the longest length of the area rug parallel to headboard & night stands.

It is recommended that at least 18" of flooring is visible around the perimeter of the room.

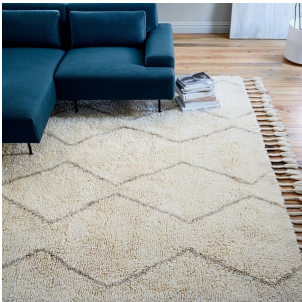
Selecting Area Rugs in Open Concept

OPEN CONCEPT SPACES CAN BE A LITTLE TRICKY.

HOW DO YOU MATCH AREA RUG SIZES AND STYLES?

DO YOU TREAT THE SPACES INDEPENDENTLY OR NOT?

IF YOU HAVE AN OPEN CONCEPT, AND WOULD LIKE TO PLACE AREA RUGS IN BOTH YOUR LIVING AND DINING AREA, THERE ARE A FEW DIFFERENT WAYS IN WHICH YOU CAN ADD TWO AREA RUGS AND ACHIEVE A COHESIVE LOOK.



A) Style

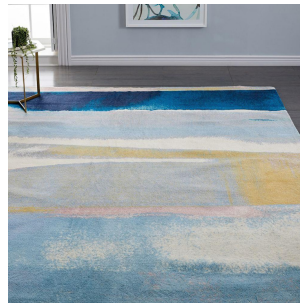
Select the same style and colour of area rugs for each dedicated space.

They can be different sizes as each space may have different size requirements.

B) Collection

Choose two area rugs that are from the same collection.

This will allow you to select the area rugs in the same colours but with different style or patterns..



C) Complimentary

Select a different style or pattern of area rugs in two different, but complimentary, colours.

Try to select similar patterns, whether that is geometric or organic in style.
